Steven Reineke made his TSO conducting début on March 17, 1997, in a program that included music by Jacques Offenbach, Georges Bizet, John Williams, Kurt Weill, Henry Mancini, Leonard Bernstein, Richard Rodgers, and John Lennon and Paul McCartney.

His début as TSO
Principal Pops Conductor
was on October 4, 2012,
in a program titled
Hollywood Hits, which
featured songs ranging
from "Hooray for
Hollywood" to Elton
John's "Circle of Life"
from The Lion King.
The 2023/24 season
marks the start of his
second decade as the
TSO's Principal Pops
Conductor.

## Steven Reineke, conductor

Steven Reineke is one of North America's leading conductors of popular music and is in his second decade as Music Director of The New York Pops at Carnegie Hall. Additionally, he is Principal Pops Conductor of the National Symphony Orchestra at the John F. Kennedy Center for the Performing Arts, Houston Symphony, and Toronto Symphony Orchestra.

Reineke is a frequent guest conductor and can be seen on the podium with the Chicago, Philadelphia, Dallas, San Francisco, and Detroit Symphony Orchestras.

On stage, Reineke creates and collaborates with a range of leading artists from the worlds of hip-hop, R&B, Broadway, television, and rock including Maxwell, Common, Kendrick Lamar, Nas, Ne-Yo, Barry Manilow, Cynthia Erivo, Ben Rector, Cody Fry, Sutton Foster, Amos Lee, Dispatch, Jason Mraz, and Ben Folds, amongst others. In 2017 he was featured on National Public Radio's All Things Considered leading the National Symphony Orchestra —a first in for the show's 45-year history—performing live music excerpts in between news segments. In 2018 Reineke led the National Symphony Orchestra with hip-hop legend Nas performing his seminal album Illmatic on PBS's Great Performances. As the creator of hundreds of orchestral arrangements. Reineke's work is performed worldwide, and it can be heard on numerous Cincinnati Pops Orchestra recordings. His symphonic works Celebration Fanfare, Legend of Sleepy Hollow, and Casey at the Bat are performed frequently in North America, including performances by the New York Philharmonic and Los Angeles Philharmonic. His Sun Valley Festival Fanfare was used to commemorate the Sun Valley Summer Symphony's pavilion, and his Festival Te Deum and Swans Island Sojourn were débuted by the Cincinnati Symphony and Cincinnati Pops Orchestras. His numerous wind ensemble compositions are published by the C.L. Barnhouse Company and are performed by concert bands perennially.

A native of Ohio, Reineke is a graduate of Miami University of Ohio (2020 Alumnus Distinguished Achievement Medal), where he earned Bachelor of Music degrees with honours in both Trumpet Performance and Music Composition. He currently resides in New York City with his husband, Eric Gabbard.

Ashley Brown made her TSO début in October 2012.

Ashley Brown originated the title role in *Mary Poppins* on Broadway, for which she received Outer Critics Circle, Drama League, and Drama Desk nominations for Best Actress. Brown also starred as Mary Poppins in the national tour of *Mary Poppins* where she garnered a 2010 Garland Award for Best Performance in a Musical. Brown's other Broadway credits include Belle in *Beauty and the Beast*, and she has starred in the national tour of Disney's *On the Record*. Brown recently returned to the Lyric Opera

of Chicago to star in the role of Laurey in *Oklahoma!*. She previously played Magnolia opposite Nathan Gunn in Francesca Zambello's *Show Boat* at the Lyric Opera of Chicago.

Brown has performed with virtually all of the top orchestras in North America including the Boston Pops, New York Philharmonic, Hollywood Bowl Orchestra at Disney Hall, Pittsburgh Symphony, New York Pops at Carnegie Hall (three times), Fort Worth Symphony, Cincinnati Pops, Philadelphia Orchestra (two times), Milwaukee Symphony, Indianapolis Symphony (three times), Seattle Symphony, Houston Symphony, Vancouver Symphony, and Philly Pops. She has also performed with the BBC Orchestra opposite Josh Groban.

Brown made her solo concert début at the Kennedy Center as part of Barbara Cook's Spotlight Series, and has appeared in New York City at prestigious venues including Feinstein's at the Regency and Birdland. Other projects include a star turn at La Jolla Playhouse in a production of *Limelight*, *The Sound of Music* at The Muny in St. Louis, which garnered her a Kevin Kline Award, and her own PBS special called *Ashley Brown: Call Me Irresponsible*, which received a PBS Telly Award. Brown's long-awaited album of Broadway and American Songbook standards is available on Ghostlight/Sony. Brown is a graduate of the Cincinnati Conservatory of Music.
